THE ASSOCIATION

Background: Sixty-four (64) years ago on a cold Sunday evening in Queens, New York, two 'Cornwallians' got together with a small group of 'Old Boys' and started the Cornwall College Old Boy's Association. Over the years, the association has had its 'ups and downs' but has never faltered in its mission of helping Cornwall College and the communities in which its members live.

Values: In the pursuit of our objectives we are guided by honesty, integrity, respect for others, sincerity, love and the fear of God. We will give service diligently, to the best of our ability, without expecting a reward in return.

Operation: The Association is managed by an executive committee consisting of the officers and the chair of all committees. The officers are: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Business Manager, Asst-Business Manger, Sergeant at –Arms and the Immediate Past President. The committees are Education, Membership Development, Sports, Business/Entertainment and Journal. All committees consist of a minimum of five members, and the President is an ex-officio member of the committees.

Membership consists of active and associate members. An active member is a former student of Cornwall College whose reputation and general conduct is above reproach. An associate member is any person whose reputation is also above reproach, shows interest in the work of the association, and is recommended by an active member. This person (male or female) must be approved by a majority of the active members of the Association.

The association meets once per month usually on the first Sunday. Election of the officers takes place annually by a plurality of votes of the active members present and voting in person. The chair of the committee is appointed by the President.

Roberts' rule of order is the governing parliamentary authority on conflicts arising on procedure.

Tax Benefit: The Association is a **NOT-FOR** –**PROFIT** (**IRS CODE 501** (**C**) **3**) Alumni Organization, thus all contributions of/to CCOBA-NY are tax-deductible to the extent allowable by the federal government of the USA.



Message from THE PRESIDENT

On behalf of the Cornwall College Old Boys' Association of New York (CCOBANY), I would like to extend greetings to all our members, friends, and supporters. Sixty-four years is indeed a very long time in the life of any organization and as such we, the officers, and members of this organization, should feel a sense of pride. The Association could not exist without the sustained

support of members and non-members over these many years. A big 'shout out' to those who have been on this journey with us.

In the book, **Philosophy & Opinion of Marcus Garvey**, he stated, "*You can be educated in soul, vision and feeling, as well as in mind.*" Bearing this in mind, the Cornwall College Mentoring and Tutoring Initiative (CCMTI) was launched in September of 2022, during *Orientation Week* of the 2022-2023 school year. It was launched after almost a year of planning and even though it is being spearheaded by the New York chapter, it was intended and is a Cornwall College Old Boys' Association initiative.

For many years, we have been lamenting the state of the overall academic performance of the boys, and the always interesting response from 'Old Boys'...what are we going to do about it?

In a meeting with the Principal, Michael Ellis three years ago, he expressed a desire for 'Old Boys' to initiate a sustained mentoring program at the school. He explained that the need was great since too many of the young men were not grasping fully the educational opportunity the school has to offer. What he had to say can be summed up by stating that there was too much indiscipline, lack of focus on learning, and poor academic performance.

The CCMTI is not intended to negate the contributions being made in other areas of the school. The greatest asset that the school has is the students who are in attendance and the initiative is intended to focus on the wholistic development of the students. This chapter offers several scholarships, in academics and athletics, to present boys and it is our policy that every scholarship recipient must have a mentor. For school year 2023-2024, we are offering approximately US \$9,000 in scholarships.


The New York chapter has allocated US \$5,000 for tutoring for the Academic Year 2023-2024. We are grateful for the partnership that the other chapters are offering.







Irwine Clare, Sr., was born in what he unwaveringly refers to as the best parish; St. Ann, Jamaica, in the district of Bamboo, and is a proud alum of York Castle High School.

Nurtured by a caring mother and family, that emphasized the importance of education and community, social services soon became a part of his young life that included membership with the Jamaica Agricultural Society (JAS) and the establishment of a basic school, library service and communication network in the area.

Inevitably, social responsibility was birthed and is now a recognized ingredient of his modus operandi.

Irwine is an accomplished trailblazer. With a visible yet unrelenting and outstanding service to the Jamaican Diaspora and the Caribbean community, especially here in the Northeast USA, he has created platforms that foster change, growth and empowerment.

While investing in professional and community development through the Caribbean Immigrant Services initiative, he founded Team Jamaica Bickle (TJB), an impactful organization that has resulted in effective participation, sustenance and development of athletes and students not only from Jamaica but the Caribbean region, formulating cultural alliances at the century old, Penn Relays Carnival, Philadelphia, USA.

A staunch yet modest and effective advocate, Clare, Sr., has earned his stripes in mass media, as a voice of reason both on radio and television. Up until recently, His 'moving forward' segments on the booming IrieJam Radio platform, were a must listen.

Clare remains a fixture not only in Diaspora communities but globally and was duly recognized by the Government and people of Jamaica with a national award, Order of Distinction (OD), in October 2013, for leadership roles with the Union of Jamaican Alumni Associations (UJAA), USA, Inc., the Jamaica Progressive League (JPL) and the National Association of Jamaican and Supportive Organizations (NAJASO), among others.

In addition to his many service activities, Clare has been the vice-president at a bank, hosted his own television and radio shows (Caribbean Lifestyle Magazine), helped draft and review legislation pertaining to immigration, and worked for the federal government as a consultant on special projects.

Irwine Clare, Sr, OD, is a proud father of two (2), daughter, Dr. Kayla Clare, and Irwine Clare Jr., and grandfather to Zion and remains resolute in his advocacy to be an agent for the changes needed in pursuit for non-disproportionate society.

Royal Caribbean Bakery was founded in 1978, on Dyre Avenue, Bronx, New York by Vincent and Jeanette HoSang. The 3,000 sq. foot facility, remains the home of one of the Royal Caribbean Bakery Retail locations. In 1987, as part of the company's expansion drive, the HoSangs purchased Royal Caribbean Bakery's 20,000 sq. ft. corporate facility which is located at 620 South Fulton Avenue, Mt. Vernon, NY.

Both Vincent and Jeanette HoSang (the founders of Royal Caribbean Bakery) were born and raised on the island of Jamaica in an atmosphere rich in diversity, culture, music and cuisine. After migrating to the United States, introducing the tantalizing tastes of Jamaica to the New York area only seemed natural - hence the beginning of their flagship establishment.

As the business grew, so too did the company's understanding and appreciation of its corporate responsibility, resulting in an enviable collection of honors, awards and citations from international, federal, national, state and local organizations and associations.

In 2015, alum Dr. Vicent Getchun HoSang, (Hon), was presented with the Order of Jamaica (OJ), the nation's fourth highest honor, for philanthropic services to Jamaica and the Diaspora, especially in the areas of healthcare and education.

Tuesday, **September 5, 2023** -- Several Cornwall College Old Boys' Associations from across Jamaica and North America, in tandem with the school's administration, have pooled their resources to create the Cornwall College Mentoring Initiative (CCMI), which should become active on campus this academic year.

The principal goals of the CCMI are to increase graduation rates while lowering dropout rates at all levels of the school. We would also like to see higher college enrollment rates, stronger relationships with parents,

teachers, and peers, and higher success rates in CXC and CAPE school exit examinations.

The mentoring program will start

with the Upper school (Sixth Formers), then move to Fifth Formers, and then to the lower grade levels. I am sure that you will agree that our collective efforts will continue to create and yield positive outcomes for the students and the greater good of our beloved Alma mater, Cornwall College.







FROM THE ARCHIVES By Dale Brown A review of the Pole Vault THE GOLDEN ERA



Cornwall College began an era of unprecedented dominance in the Open Pole Vault at the 1956 edition of 'Boys Championships'.

This golden era lasted for eleven years from 1956 to 1966 and was sparked by four athletes who were responsible for the school winning nine titles during this period (1956-66).

The sequence began with **Micky Arthurs** who won two titles outright in **1956** and **1957** and shared another with his teammate **R.S. Morris** and Stewart of Munro in **1958**. (11'4" rec.)

Morris successfully defended the title in **1959** with a record $(11'10 \frac{1}{2}" \text{Rec.})$ clearance.

Othnel Thomas extended the streak to six straight by winning in **1960** and **1961**.

There was a two-year break before **George Thomas** (Othnel's younger brother), secured dominant victories in 1964, 65 and 66. The last two were achieved in record equaling (1965) fashion and culminated with the first 12' vault in 1966. In addition to his three wins, George Thomas also placed 4th in 1962, and 2nd in 1963.



The late George 'Timmo' Thomas, Esq., was recognized by the Government and people of Jamaica, with the order of distinction (OD), in 2010. He served as President of the County of Cornwall Bar Association. He died under tragic circumstances in August, 2015.

THE LEGENDARY GEORGE THOMAS

In addition to his pole vault exploits, George Thomas proved to be a versatile athlete as he is rated among the best to ever represent Cornwall College.

George twice achieved the unique double by winning the Open Pole Vault and Open Triple Jump titles in 1965 and 1966. He held the records for both events.

Cornwall College maintained a presence in the discipline for the next eleven years (1967 -77) with one gold medal and four other medal winning performances.

Courtney Alexander became the school's fifth pole vault champion at 'Boys Champs' when he won the event in 1974.

Top three placings were earned by **McLaughlin** 2nd in 1969, **H. Clacken** 3rd in 1970, **Michael Harrison** 3rd in 1973, and Justin Cooke 3rd in 1977.







Donning thirty six (36) years, this gentle giant has moulded the lives of thousands of young Cornwallians. Her descriptor has given broader meaning to being an educator; as one of a role model, confidante, mother, as well as commissioner of students' advocacy and legal services.

In her firm momentousness, she carried herself with such poised grace and class - no facade.

Mrs. Virgo self-sanctioned her own tenacity to transform from shy Vinnette Lawrence to bold and composed Vinnette Virgo, after the precedent set by Vilma Baugh and Doris Hamilton-Willie, both former vice-principals and acting principals who Mrs. Virgo characterized as women of integrity and principle.

Despite changes and challenges at Cornwall College, Vinnette Lawrence Virgo morphed into her God-given duty of boldly and unreservedly transforming boys into MEN of MIGHT. She served officially and unofficially as acting principal for two years, prior she took on the role of Grade Eight Supervisor from 1992 to 2006. She then served concomitantly as Head of the Mathematics Department; Sixth Form Supervisor and time-table Coordinator from 2006- 2008. Her office of vice principal was from 2008 to present.

Mrs. Virgo is a visionary. She was covertly behind several fundamental changes at Cornwall College. And, she also conceptualized and implemented many of her own programmes that engendered students' social and academic growth. These programmes included the Grade 7-9 Quiz; the Inaugural Grade 8 Day which set a model for the annual event later done by other grades. Additionally Mrs. Virgo implemented the Homework Programmes in Collaboration with parents and Providence Kiwanis Club. Finally, with gusto and the goal intended, Mrs. Virgo effectuated the inaugural Grade 9 'Operation Big Deal' project which promoted Mathematics and English.

Mrs. Virgo taught Mathematics from grade 7 through 11; Integrated Science from 7 grade through 9 and Human and Social Biology at grades 10 and 11. From 1987 to present, her tenure of service spanned eight principals, including acting principals. These changing of guards brought different climates. New students brought novel challenges. While it was not an easy feat, she held firm to the assurance of the scripture of Habakkuk 3 vs 19 which reads "The Lord is my strength and he will make my feet like hinds' feet..."

Head boy from the class of 2005 and 2007 described Mrs. Virgo as a dedicated educator with a firm but gentle approach to her students. He asserted that she was committed to the success of her students as individuals, as well as the success of the institution, Cornwall College. Deroi Brown promulgated that Mrs. Virgo has served her nation with distinction in her calling as a teacher/school administrator. Admired and respected by many, Mrs. Virgo has given unwavering and unstinting devotion. She inspired; she encouraged; she modelled Christ-like behaviour.

Her mantra was repeated daily which was that her role, in the lives of every boy who came through Cornwall College, was first a ministry, given to her by God. Religiously, as encouragement or as a reminder, Mrs. Virgo emphasized that she stood on the promises and strength of God. Mrs. Vinette Lawrence Virgo, indeed, a steward of uncommon standing.



TRACK AND FIELD REPORT Western Regional Championships February 15 and 18, 2023

For the first time since 2020, the County of Cornwall Athletics Association (CoCAA) Western Champion-ships returned to a full schedule of events.

The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic had forced the meet to be scaled down to a one-day event in 2021 and 2022.



The qualifiers were held on February 15, 2023, at Herbert Morrison Technical High School in Montego Bay and St. Elizabeth Technical High School (STETHS), hosted the finals in Santa Cruz, St Elizabeth, on Saturday February 18.

Thirty-nine (39) boys competed in individual events and another six (6) boys completed the rosters for the relay pools including the Open 4x400m and 1600m Sprint Medley relays.

The team fell short of the expected point production and could only manage to place fourth in the standings with a total of 159.83 points.

Lansford Cunningham, Long Jumper

A few factors beyond our control contributed to the low output.

Class 1 Triple Jump was not contested due to the meet organizers' decision.

Class 2 Triple Jump was not scored.

The Open 4x400m relay was not completed due to a power outage.

Then, we did not help ourselves by,

Dropping the baton in the 4x100m Class 2 relay.

Being DQ'd in the 4x100m Class 4.

We were expected to score at least an additional 50 pointy in these events.

Twenty-one (21) boys were responsible for 140.83 points in the individual events. Another 19 points came from the relays, for a total of 159.83 points, giving Cornwall 4th place behind champions, STETHS, followed by Munro College and Petersfield High School.

The leading point producers were, Class 3 athlete Thomas Daley, who won silver in the 100m (11.16) and 200m (23.37) for 14 points and Mario Birch, who scored 13 points by earning silver in the class 2 intermediate hurdles (55.77) and bronze in the 400m (50.84).

Daley also won a bronze medal with the 3rd placed class 3 relay team.

The team won two gold medals courtesy of Class 1 High Jumper Amuiki Beckford (1.90m) and class 4 athlete Drayden Knight (12.44) in the 80m hurdles.

First year class 1 thrower Mar-lando Farquharson showed that he has made a smooth transition to the heavier weights as he placed 3rd in the Shot Put (16.40m).

Although the 4x400m relay was ruled incomplete by the officials, the team won their section of the timed finals, thanks to an excellent anchor leg by Zachary Cox who reminded all of his vast potential.

Overall, the team won 2 gold, 3 silver and 8 bronze for a total of 13 medals (12 individual and 1 in the class 3 relay).

BOYS CHAMPS REPORT

The Cornwall College Track and Field team traveled to Kingston on Monday, March 27, to compete at the ISSA/ Grace Kennedy Boys and Girls Athletics Championships scheduled for Tuesday, March 28 through Saturday, April 1.

The coaches and management team hoped for a continuation of the upward trajectory shown during the past few championships.

- 2019, the points total 7.
- 2020, competition was canceled (COVID).
- 2021, points total 18.50.
- 2022, points total 22

Cornwall College finish 10th at ISSA / Grace Kennedy Boys and Girls Championships, 2023

This optimism was justified as the team responded to the meticulous preparation, inspirational talks and confidence shown in them by elevating their performances and achieving several personal bests (PB).

As a result, Cornwall College scored thirty-one (31) points and finished 10th at the 2023 edition of the ISSA Boys and Girls Championships that concluded Saturday April 1st.

This output resulted in the team scoring the most points and achieving their highest placing since the 2015 season when they scored thirty-eight (38) points and placed ninth (9) overall.

The Championships.

Coaches **Christopher Mitchell** and **Sean Rhooms** led a team of twenty-six boys to represent the school at this years' edition of 'Champs'.

Twenty-three boys qualified for individual events while two others were selected to complete the relay pools and one was chosen as a reserve for the class 1, high jump.

Kesean Rhooms wins bronze in class 1 Triple Jump

First year class 1 athlete **Kesean Rhooms** provided the highlight for the team by winning the only medal (bronze) for (6 pts), in the Triple Jump with a career best 14.50m (47' 7"). Rhooms also finished 8th (1 pt) in the High Jump 1.85m (6' $\frac{3}{4}$ ").

Promising Class 3 sprinter **Thomas Daley** finished 5th in the 100m (11.14) and 200m (23.47) and scored 4 points in each event.

Daley underlined his immense talent by clocking a 22.98 personal best (PB) in the opening round of the 200m.

Lansford Cunningham improved his PB to 7.09m (23' 3¹/₄") to finish 4th (5 pts) in the class 1 Long Jump. Cunningham achieved the mark on his first jump before aggravating an injury which forced him to pass on his final three attempts.

High Jumper **Carlyle Tinglin** placed 4th (5 pts) in the class 3 event with a $1.75m (5' 8^{3}/4'')$ clearance for a PB. Tinglin is better known as the goalkeeper for the DaCosta Cup football team.

Class 1 High Jumper **Amiuki Beckford** continued his series of consistent performances and cleared 1.95m $(6^{\circ} 4^{3}_{4})^{\circ}$ to place 6th (3 pts).

Class 3 athlete **Requelme Reid** was responsible for the other three points as he placed 6th in the 200m (23.57).

Congratulations to the athletes and the coaches for achieving the top ten finish.

They deserve all accolades.


